Activities and Announcements for the Month of July

- 1. <u>First Saturday Mass July 6 at 8 am</u>. There is also Mass on the other Saturdays of the month at 8 am. The Mass readings are for Saturday while the 5:30 Vigil Mass has the readings for Sunday and thus fulfills the Sunday obligation. On December 10, 1925 Mary appeared to Lucia with the following message in her own words: "Behold, my daughter, my Heart encircled with thorns, with which ungrateful men pierce it at every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. Give me consolation, you, at least; and make known on my behalf that I promise to assist at the hour of death, with the graces necessary for salvation, all who on the First Saturday of five consecutive months confess their sins, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep me company for fifteen minutes meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, with the purpose of making reparation to my Immaculate Heart."
- 2. <u>Eucharistic Adoration</u> July 7 after the 10 am Mass. The Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will conclude with Vespers and Benediction at 4 pm. Brother Knight, if you come for adoration, please kneel/sit in the front row on the left for as long as you desire, be it only 15 minutes or more as part of an Honor Guard. You don't have to be in regalia. Former Grand Knight Bruce Davison usually occupies the first row on the right for most of the time, including the all-nighters. You can do spiritual reading; converse with the Lord; and share your innermost thoughts and concerns with Him to obtain healing. You will find peace. The recommended community intention for July is our Country and for religious freedom everywhere. The next one will be on Sunday August 4. There is also adoration at 7 8 am before morning daily Mass.
- 3. Monthly Business Dinner Meeting Monday July 22 at 6:30 pm with Eucharistic Adoration at 4:30 pm and Mass at 5:30 pm. Prayer is essential to our success. Members are urged to attend both the Mass and the meeting that follows with supper, great fellowship, decision making on future activities, planning, and coordination.
