The family, the basic unit of Society and the Church, is under attack from all sides. About half of all marriages break up. Despite required marriage preparation, Catholic homes are not immune to the tragedy of divorce and the children suffer the most psychologically and spiritually. The Church teaches that real marriage can only be the union of one man and one woman in complete giving of self to each other (Theology of the Body). In divorce and so called same sex marriage, children are deprived of benefitting from the special God given gifts that only a mother AND a father can provide. Men and women are different and complement each other with special talents, traits, and gifts. Even intact families are often dysfunctional with excessive drama. Most children only have an absentee father as a result of sex outside of marriage and divorce. Single mothers and cohabitation for convenience or pleasure are all too common.

The Knights of Columbus has stepped into the breach to promote and strengthen the Domestic Church. The term "Domestic Church" dates to the 1st Century A.D. It is the Christian family, the smallest body of gathered believers in Christ. That makes the home a little church. The Early Church Fathers recognized the home as fertile ground for discipleship, sanctification, and holiness. The Church has always believed in the importance of the home, but today a renewed emphasis on the concept of Domestic Church is URGENT. Christ must be the center of the home. The importance of the Faith must be central.....family prayer, Sunday Mass as a family every single Sunday, confession at least once a year, active participation in parish life, bedtime stories of the saints, children's bible story books, at least some holy pictures on the walls of the house, talking about the Faith, virtue, etc. at dinner. THE PRINCIPLE EDUCATORS IN THE FAITH ARE PARENTS, not PSR whose function is only to assist parents. If you don't do anything to make your house a domestic church, it is little more than a glorified hotel that provides room, board, and material needs. Changing the world begins with a solid domestic church.

According to Jason Angelette of the Archdiocese of New Orleans, good marriages "must be built on a foundation, not a tool box." Tools learned at a workshop are valuable, but a solid spiritual foundation must come first. Echoing Pope St. John Paul II, the foundation should include regular prayer, reception of the Holy Eucharist and Reconciliation. "Bishop Fulton Sheen (soon to be beatified) noted that Christ's first recorded word in His public ministry was 'Come' and His last word was 'Go'", Angelette said. "We must continue to come to Christ for that grace we need and then go and love."
