After a special Mass for the occasion, our pastor read a portion of a touching speech given by Mother Teresa in condemning abortion at the 1994 National Prayer Breakfast attended by President Bill Clinton and First Lady Hilary Clinton, numerous congressmen, and other notables. Then Fr. Hamm blessed the monument donated by our Knights of Columbus Council 3335. The dedication on September 5 coincided with the feast day of St. Mother Teresa, canonized the day before (see Blog #176 at paulrsebastianphd.blogspot.com; the article has a link to that video of Mother Teresa's speech and describes her relationship with Hillary Clinton & efforts to convert her). ## **November Activities and Announcements**

- 1. First Degree Initiation of New Knights Sunday October 30 at 3 pm in the Parish Hall. All faithful practicing Catholic men (18 and over) are invited to join. Prospective members are invited to contact David Stapleton, the grand knight at 740-612-9848 or Nathan Frazee at 740-794-1208. We ask all knights to recruit new members, telling them about the many benefits of the Knights of Columbus for great fellowship, opportunities to serve the parish and the community, and the best Life Insurance that money can buy. Any surplus finances Knights of Columbus charities and rebates to you. Please welcome and honor the new knights with your presence. Wear your Knights of Columbus shirts or ask for one. If too late, recruit for the next initiation.
- 2. <u>All Saints Kids Party</u> *Wednesday November 2 at 6 pm in the Parish Hall*. Kids of all ages, teachers too are invited to dress up as a saint rather than a ghost, goblin, witch, or other reference to evil. The kids will learn about saints from the adults and from each other.
- 3. The Knights continue to sponsor and lead the rosary 25 to 30 minutes before the Masses of the first Saturday and first Sunday of the month. For November it's Saturday the 5<sup>th</sup> and Sunday the 6<sup>th</sup>. The next rosary will be on the week end of December 3-4. After the Mass, the Rosary is the most perfect prayer which Mary gave us. Our Lady urges us to pray the rosary for peace daily; the need is urgent.
- **4.** Eucharistic Adoration Sunday November 6, after the 10 am Mass. The Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will conclude with Vespers and Benediction at 4 pm. It would be great to have a Knights of Columbus Honor Guard there. Brother Knight, if you come for adoration, please kneel/sit in the front row on the left for as long as you desire, be it only 15 minutes or more. You don't have to be in regalia. Former Grand Knight Bruce Davison usually occupies the first row on the right for most of the time, including the all-nighters. You can do spiritual reading; converse with the Lord; and share your innermost thoughts and concerns with Him to obtain healing and strength to keep going. **The recommended community prayer intention for November** is for the poor souls in purgatory and that the world may recognize Christ as their true sovereign king of the universe.
