NEWS AND ACTIVITIES OF THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS ST. LOUIS COUNCIL 3335

This Consecration is historical because it is the first time ever (as far as we know) that any council of the Knights of Columbus consecrated itself to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. May many other councils do the same. Our thanks to our Grand Knight David Stapleton for initiating this act of consecrating our council which follows the Reconsecration of our Diocese of Steubenville to the Immaculate Heart. By this consecration we place ourselves and our council in the hands of Mary and ask for her protection and guidance to more effectively serve her Son and His Church and His people while growing closer to the Immaculate Heart and the Sacred Heart which are united as one.

A few hours later in the afternoon we followed up the Consecration of our Council to the Immaculate Heart of Mary with the induction of four new knights: Clifford Leport, Alex White, Jedidiah Ott, and James Mosher. Thomas Hamm and by vote of the membership at the November meeting, the participation of the knights of Council 3335 in full regalia and the Mass intention for our deceased knights every year on the solemn Feast of Christ the King will be an annual event for both Council 3335 and our parish. December Activities and Announcements

- <u>The Knights continue to sponsor and lead the rosary</u> 25 to 30 minutes before the Masses of the first Saturday and first Sunday of the month. For December it's Saturday the 3rd and Sunday the 4th. The next rosary will be on Sunday January 1 and Saturday January 7. After the Mass, the Rosary is the most perfect prayer which Mary Herself gave us. Our Lady urges us to pray the rosary for peace daily; the need is urgent.
- 2. <u>4th Degree Christmas Party</u> Sunday December 4 in Churchtown at 2 pm. Bishop Monforton, a 4th Degree knight will share the meal with us. Treat your wife to a delicious steak dinner. She deserves it.
- 3. <u>All Night and All Day Eucharistic Adoration for the Feast of the Immaculate Conception</u> at the end of the 5:30 pm Mass on Wednesday December 7 until the evening Mass at 7 pm on December 8. It would be great if every knight in our Council would sign up for an hour of the day or night to kneel on the side of our former Grand Knight, thus forming an Honor Guard. Brother Knight, if you come for adoration, please kneel/sit in the front row on the left for as long as you desire, be it only 15 minutes or more. You don't have to be in regalia. You can do spiritual reading; converse with the Lord; and share your innermost thoughts and concerns with Him to obtain healing and strength to keep going. The recommended prayer intention for December is wisdom and divine guidance for President Elect Donald Trump in choosing his cabinet and organizing his administration.
- 4. <u>Farewell gathering for brother knight Fr. David Schmidt</u> at *Sacred Heart Church Point Pleasant* on *Saturday December 10 at 4 pm. He will celebrate Mass the next day at 11 am at the same church.* Our brother knight, Fr. Dave will be moving to Dayton closer to his family as a retired priest while continuing to serve the Church as he can. He faithfully served the Church in Mason County and us also for a number of years. He was our lector at meetings. Fr. Schmidt commented that our council is the most active that he has served with.
- 5. <u>K of C Benefit Breakfast</u> *Sunday December 11 after the 8 am and 10 am Masses* (2nd Sunday of each month). It will be great fellowship and delicious food with a lot of love added to it to strengthen our parish community. Bring your family and friends.
