
BIG NEWS! St. Louis Church and other Catholic churches of the Diocese of Steubenville will have public Holy Mass and the Eucharist again on **Sunday**......5:30 pm Saturday; 8 am and 10 am Sunday morning.....just in time for the great feast of Pentecost! However, each person in the congregation must be six feet apart while the seating is supposed to be not more than 50% of its normal capacity of 140 people. This amounts to 50 people according to the new norms. Sadly, ushers are asked not to let any more people in. Only members of the same household may sit together. Hand sanitizer is available at the door. Masks are strongly encouraged as is receiving Holy Communion in the hand. Highly touched items will be sanitized between Masses and of course the hands of the Eucharistic Ministers. The faithful will continue to be dispensed from the Sunday obligation. It is recommended that at risk people and their care givers not attend Mass. EWTN has daily Mass live at 8 am repeated via video midnight tape at noon, pm, and and anvtime 7 at www.youtube.com/ewtn. Bishop Robert Barron and Fr. Steve Grunow have a video taped Mass at the convenience of the user with very insightful homilies at www.wordonfire.org/daily-mass. A Life, a Poppy to honor a fallen soldier. The USAA (an auto and housing insurance organization for active military, veterans, and their families) has a special way for honoring our fallen soldiers. Their Poppy Wall of Honor was created in partnership with The American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars to help ensure the sacrifice of our military men and women is always remembered. Many of the fallen were members of the Knights of Columbus.

The wall contains more than 645,000 artificial poppies — one for each American life lost in the line of duty since World War I. The red flowers fill one side; historic facts about U.S. conflicts cover the opposite side. The exhibit was installed on the National Mall in Washington, D.C., over the Memorial Day weekend in 2018 and 2019. It is available to more people this year by presenting the educational panels of the wall digitally. Fr. Michael McGivney in his rectory at age 28 in 1880 in New Haven, Connecticut. He is wearing a cassock, which was customary at the time and through the middle of the 20th Century. Today it is making a comeback in some circles. It is already standard garb in most seminaries.

Miracle attributed to the intercession of Fr. Michael McGivney approved by the Vatican after extensive investigation. In 2015 a baby was healed in utero of a life-threatening condition after prayers by his family to Father McGivney for his intercession. He founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882 based upon its four core principles of Christian charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism. He was decades ahead of his time in giving the laity an important role within the Church......well before the Second Vatican Council (1962-65). This assures his beatification. Interesting is that Fr. McGivney died of pneumonia at the young age of 38 as a victim of the pandemic of 1890. May he intercede on our behalf during the pandemic we are living through 130 years later.
