The Domestic Church is the theme of the 2020 Family Fest in Crown City October 18-24. If you build it, they will come. Every summer since 2015 brother knight Tim Stapleton and his family of eight have attended the week long Family Fests at Catholic Familyland at Bloomingdale, Ohio off of Route 22 near Steubenville (see www.afc.org). They loved it so much that Tim and his wife Chrissy had an implausible thought: "Let's bring Familyland to Gallia County to the few acres of land that Tim's parents own in Crown City." The first fest in October 2017 began with one day; in 2018 it was two days, inviting local family, friends, and their kids.

Last year they got more ambitious with a weekend. The Stapletons took it on as an extended family project to build a chapel, seating about 25 people. The building was engineered by his father, John Stapleton. Brother knights Mike Stapleton, cousin DJ, and his brother-in-law Grand Knight Tyler Reynolds had a part. They did build it and they came, over a hundred people.....for camping, sports, fishing, games, face painting, fellowship, grilled food on the fire, daily Mass, rosary & marshmallows around a bonfire,

the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3 pm, etc. All who came had a good time, playing, praying, and learning about the faith.

One day this past winter very gusty winds destroyed the chapel. Nothing keeps the extended Stapleton family down, be it fire that destroyed his sister's family home or wind. Undeterred, the Stapletons reconstructed the chapel and plan to make the 2020 October Family Fest bigger and better with hiking, crafts, dancing, a movie night, and several speakers on how to make the home a domestic church where Jesus Christ is the center of the family and all grow in Christian virtue. This year the Knights of Columbus Council 3335 has agreed to be one of the sponsors as the Fest expands to seven days.

Sunday afternoon October 18 is the first day as people arrive and pitch their tents (no campers). There are hotels in Gallipolis, a half hour away. Everyone is invited from here, there and everywhere be it for one day or
