Supreme Knight Carl Anderson Receives Pro-Life Legacy Award

At the virtual 2021 Rose Dinner pro-life gala on January 29, the evening of the virtual march for life, Carl Anderson was recognized for "a lifetime of exceptional work advocating for the inherent dignity of the unborn human person".

Interesting is the talk he gave upon receiving the award. At the beginning he paid tribute to Nellie Gray, the founder of the March For Life and Congressman Henry Hyde of Illinois, a tireless fighter for the pro-life cause and proponent of the 1976 Hyde Amendment which prohibits any federal spending on abortion except in the case of rape, incest, or to save the life of the mother. Currently, there is great fear that the new administration and Congress will repeal it. Anderson wrote two best selling books: "A Civilization of Love: What Every Catholic Can Do to Transform the World" and his most recent "These Liberties We Hold Sacred" on faithful citizenship, a collection of his speeches and essays on the confluence of faith and public life.

Anderson referred to St. John Paul II's encyclical, "Evangelium Vitae" (Gospel of Life) and quoted the great Russian novelist, Fyodor Dostoyevsky: "If one begins with unlimited freedom, one will end up with unlimited despotism". He also referred to the opinion of Dr. John Hart Feley of the Yale Law School that Roe v Wade is not constitutional law. Supreme Court Justice Byron White stated that Roe v Wade is "an exercise in raw judicial power" and is not settled law. One cannot judge the current by one moment in time, but over time the trend is pro-life. The Supreme Knight enumerated four principles of the Pro-Life cause.

Commitment to Justice. It is always wrong to kill a human being. If the Government sanctions abortion, it can sanction anything. Society tends to treat the baby, who is too young to exercise certain rights, as though s/he has no rights at all. Every human being has certain rights; the most basic of all is the right to life. However, the judges ruled that the right to privacy is implied by the Constitution and thus includes abortion in its shadow. Then a legal metaphor becomes legal reality. The framers of the Constitution protected us against non-enumerated rights which can be manipulated. The Supreme Court in 1973 said that it did not need to determine when life begins, but then assumed it begins at birth. It did not recognize the reality that life begins in the womb. Then justice is impossible and the rights of the parties cannot be determined.

Government institutions must tell us the truth. Untruth disrespects women. Segregation and its "Separate but equal" philosophy was considered "settled law", but failed the test of time because it is a lie. The truth is that the fetus is a human being. Even though the so called "right to abortion" has been "settled law" for years, no unjust law is sustainable and will also fail.

Commitment to Democracy. That is peaceful petition and assembly. The legislative and judicial branches ultimately do what is right, but the majority does not decide what is right.

Compassion, Love, and Generosity, i.e., family solidarity.....to treat the stranger more like a neighbor, and neighbor more like family when in need. The hallmark is care for neighbor. As Orestes Brownson said, "Every great nation has its "special work, mission or destiny". The Russian Theologian Vladimir Solovyov noted: "A nation is not what it thinks of itself in time, but what God thinks in eternity. Our pro-life journey is often slow, but will lead to victory.

The Knights continue to sponsor and lead the rosary 25 to 30 minutes before the Masses of the first Saturday and first Sunday of the month. For March it's Saturday the 6th and Sunday the 7th. Make a sacrifice and come a little earlier. For those who are not attending Mass because of vulnerability to Covid, the rosary is streamed along with the 10 am Mass. We are offering the rosary for the conversion of sinners, peace, for the pro-life movement, for the renewal of our parish, for the strengthening of families, for an end to the COVID-19 Pandemic, for our Country, and for personal intentions.
