You can do spiritual reading; converse with the Lord; listen to Him; and share your innermost thoughts and concerns with Him to obtain healing and strength to keep going. You will find peace. The recommended community prayer intention for July is for our Country as it celebrates 246 years of freedom and independence, for life, and for world peace especially in Ukraine. May America always be a nation under God, faithful to the vision and ideals of its founding fathers.
